

Peppa Pig's World of Play at Great Lakes Crossing: An early look inside

Kids jumped on carpets marked with mud puddles, slid down slides, played on tricycles and more at a preview Friday for [Peppa Pig's World of Play at Great Lakes Crossing Outlets](#) in Auburn Hills.

Sporting a Peppa Pig costume from Halloween, 5-year-old Arianna Rice of Macomb was exploring Rebecca Rabbits Underground Adventure. She told the Free Press she was having fun.

"I like that I get to play," she said.

Her mom, Tonya Rice, said her daughter loves the character Peppa Pig and her little brother, George Pig.

"I'm taking it all in, too. She's very excited though," Rice said. "I like the climbing structures and the interactive things."

Dawn Priebe, the attraction manager for Peppa Pig's World of Play, said the location is the third of its kind to be opening globally and the second in the U.S. — a Shanghai play space opened in October and another in the Dallas/Fort Worth area opened in January.

"We have 14 themed play areas that are lovingly created, modeling the wildly popular animated show," Priebe said. "I think you'll really enjoy Danny Dog's Garage, you'll really love Rebecca Rabbit's House, which is super fun. We've got George's Fort, so lots of things to see and do, as you'll see."

Priebe said the space is targeted toward preschoolers. About 100 kids and nearly an equal amount of parents were expected Friday — some purchased tickets, others were guests.

"Our grand opening celebration is April 9, and then we will be open 363 days a year. We will be closed on Thanksgiving and Christmas for our families to be able to enjoy time, as they should, with their families," she said.

Priebe added that the location also will be hosting sensory friendly days, where lights and sounds will be turned down.

Christina Mossine of Ferndale said her daughter, 2-year-old Frances, and son, 4-year-old Henry, were both enjoying the preview.

"It's perfect for both of them," she said.

"It's very kid friendly, and it seems safe."
